

First-Time, First-Year Provisional Admission Agreement | Spring 2026

Provisional Admission

Your admission is provisional and based on the information you shared in your application. To clear your provisions, you must continue to meet all requirements and submit official transcripts for verification.

This offer is for Spring 2026 and for the major in your admission letter only. It can't be deferred or changed before the term starts.

Mandatory Steps to Enrollment

To secure your spot at SJSU, you must complete all steps below by the deadline posted on your MySJSU account.

☐ **Complete the Next Steps Intent to Enroll process by the date posted on MySJSU**

Complete the following steps in the Intent to Enroll process on the Next Steps website (nextsteps.sjsu.edu) by the deadline.

1. Accept SJSU's offer of provisional admission (this confirms your intent to attend and your agreement to the terms).
2. Sign up for SJSU's mandatory orientation program
3. Pay the \$250 nonrefundable enrollment deposit (covers orientation and part of your Spring 2026 tuition and fees)

You'll receive a confirmation email from nextsteps@sjsu.edu within two business days. Keep it for your records.

If you run into any issues, contact nextsteps@sjsu.edu before the deadline.

☐ **Sign up for campus housing (optional)**

Sign up for campus housing, including Spartan Village on the Paseo and the International House at sjsu.edu/housing

☐ **Meet math enrollment requirements**

Your math enrollment requirement will depend on your major, completed mathematics coursework, test scores, and other factors. Although SAT and ACT scores are not used for admission review, they may be used to help identify options for your first math course. You are encouraged (but not required) to submit them if you have them.

☐ **College writing exercise – Reflection on College Writing**

The Reflection on College Writing allows you to preview the reading and writing you will do at SJSU and to find the writing courses you need. All first-time, first-year students admitted to SJSU complete this reflection as part of the transition to college learning and writing. ☐ **Send official test scores needed to fulfill admission requirements**

If you are using AP, IB, or CLEP exams to meet CSU admission requirements, contact the testing agency now and request that your official scores be sent directly to SJSU. We must receive them by January 15, 2026.

☐ **Attend mandatory orientation**

Registration for first-time, first-year students will take place during Sparta Camp.

☐ **Send your official high school transcript(s), including all completed grades and date of graduation, no later than Thursday, January 15, 2026**

Make sure to send your official mark sheet(s) and final transcript(s), including Fall 2025 grades, by January 15, 2026. If we don't receive them by the deadline, your admission will be withdrawn.

☐ **Meet immunization/vaccination requirements**

Meet immunization and vaccination requirements, which can be found at sjsu.edu/immunization

☐ **Meet the CSU minimum requirements for first-time, first-year admission**

The Office of Admissions will review your application and official transcript(s) to verify that you meet all of the admission requirements below.

- Confirm the completion of all of your "a-g" college preparatory coursework with a grade of "C-" or better by the end of Fall 2025. SJSU will accept grades of "Credit" or "Pass" to satisfy "a-g" requirements completed during Winter, Spring, Summer, or Fall 2020 terms and during Winter, Spring, or Summer 2021 terms. All prior and subsequent coursework must be graded, and a grade of "C-" or better must be earned for the course to satisfy "a-g" requirements.
- Confirm you have a minimum high school GPA of 2.50 (California Resident) or 3.0 (Nonresident of California).
- Confirm your date of high school graduation.
- Confirm you meet the minimum impact point index.

☐ **Monitor MySJSU – EXTREMELY IMPORTANT**

SJSU communicates almost entirely by messages and To Do List items posted to MySJSU (one.sjsu.edu). Check MySJSU frequently for updates to your status, important messages, and invitations to upcoming events. You are responsible for compliance with all deadlines posted on MySJSU.
