Frequently Asked Questions

What if I do not complete required courses or miss a deadline?

Your admission to SJSU will be revoked and your registration canceled. Failure to submit your transcript will result in your application being withdrawn, even if you have signed up for housing, attended Spring Orientation, or registered for classes.

What if I am taking courses required for admission during the Fall 2025 term?

You may use coursework from the Fall 2025 term to complete admission requirements. You must submit final, official transcripts showing all work completed through Fall 2025 by Thursday, January 15, so that we can verify you have met admission and impaction requirements for the Spring 2026 term.

Can I change my major?

Because SJSU is an impacted campus, change of major cannot take place prior to the start of the term and is never guaranteed even after admission to SJSU.

How do I request academic, housing, and/or orientation accommodations due to my disability?

Students requesting academic and/or housing accommodations due to disability-related limitations are encouraged to register with the Accessible Education Center as soon as possible. Register online at sjsu.edu/aec

SubmitIntent to Enroll

San José State will need to know if you plan on attending in Spring 2026 so that we can ensure we have everything in place for your enrollment. Complete the multi-step Next Steps Intent to Enroll process at nextsteps.sjsu.edu by 11:59 p.m. (Pacific Standard Time) on **Saturday, November 15** or we will assume that you do not plan to attend SJSU and your admission will be withdrawn.

You will need the following to submit your intent to enroll:

- Your nine-digit SJSU ID (provided on your Letter of Admission)
- Your SJSUOne password

The process includes accepting SJSU's offer of admission, signing up for mandatory spring orientation, and paying the nonrefundable enrollment deposit.

YES – I intend to enroll at SJSU for the Spring 2026 semester (Please note: You may not defer your enrollment to a later semester.)

NO – I will not attend SJSU for the Spring 2026 semester (Your application will be withdrawn from further consideration.)

Sign Up for Spring Orientation for Transfers

Spring orientation is a mandatory one-day orientation program that will introduce you to the campus and its resources, connect you to your college and major department, and provide you with critical academic planning information. All admitted students are required to attend this mandatory orientation for the entire duration of the program. The cost to attend orientation is \$80 and will be included in your enrollment deposit.

Before attending spring orientation, complete Spartan Link Online pre-orientation. Spring 2026 admits will be given access in mid-December 2025.

During orientation, we will:

- Discuss and explain key university services
- Facilitate connections with staff, faculty, and your fellow incoming students
- Host a General Education advising workshop to help in planning your academic schedule

Trained Orientation Leaders will:

- Answer some of your initial questions
- Provide you with information about campus programs and services
- Assist you in making the transition to SJSU

If you do not attend or leave during any portion of the program, you will not be able to attend SJSU in Spring 2026. Students who arrive late will not be allowed to attend the program.

Pay Enrollment Deposit

Please note: The \$250 enrollment deposit is nonrefundable and nontransferable, even if you do not enroll in classes for the Spring 2026 semester.

Register for Classes

You will register for classes in your MySJSU student account once you have an enrollment appointment.

Registration Appointments

You will register for classes during orientation if you have submitted all official transcripts by the date posted on your MySJSU "To Do List." Send official transcripts to verify your eliqibility to enroll as early as possible to minimize delays in the assignment of your enrollment/registration appointment.

Spring Orientation (Mandatory)

To maintain your eligibility to enroll, you must attend your scheduled spring orientation.

Registering for Courses

Sign in to one.sjsu.edu and search for "MyScheduler". MyScheduler (sjsu.edu/classes/register/myscheduler.php) will allow you to pre-plan your course schedule and send that schedule to MySJSU to complete enrollment once your enrollment appointment opens.

Registration Holds

If you have a registration hold, log in to MySJSU and go to "self-service". Look for the "Hold" box on the left navigation pane or "Hold" button at the top right column. Click on each "Hold Item" in the column and read the instructions on how to resolve your hold. If you do not have a hold, you may begin to register during your appointment time. You do not need to come in person or call us to register.

Late Registration

After the initial registration period (Advance Registration) ends, you may still register, but not until the first day of instruction. Late registration is dependent on the space available. Getting the classes you want may be very difficult..

What will I need to register for classes?

- A file of your SJSU admission information, including admission letters, grade reports, copies of transcripts from other schools, placement test scores, and everything related to your enrollment
- The SJSU Catalog, which contains descriptions of classes and major and minor requirements, is available at catalog.sjsu.edu

Once I've registered, can I change my schedule?

If work or family obligations require you to change your schedule, you may make changes to your class schedule before the last day to add/drop classes.

Important note: Before dropping/swapping any class(es) from your schedule to enroll in a different class, be sure you can successfully add the other course(s). Classes at SJSU fill up quickly. If a course you want is full, search for open sections via MySJSU. Or, place yourself on the class waitlist. It is not guaranteed that you will be able to enroll into waitlisted courses.

Can I still get academic advising in the Student Success Center if my transcripts have not been fully evaluated?

Yes. The advisors will advise you on general university expectations and graduation requirements, including general education course requirements. However, once you get your transcript fully evaluated by Admissions, you must meet with an Academic Advisor again to re-examine your general education checklist and progress toward degree completion because changes to your academic plan may have to be made. This is essential if you plan to graduate in a timely manner.

What if I don't register for the Spring 2026 semester?

Your admission is only good for the Spring 2026 semester. If you do not register for classes for Spring 2026, you will lose your admission and will have to reapply for the next available term.

Fees are Subject to Change

The CSU makes every effort to keep student costs to a minimum. Fees listed in published schedules or student accounts may need to be increased when public funding is inadequate. Therefore, the CSU reserves the right, even after initial fee payments are made, to increase or modify any listed fees, without notice, until the date when instruction for a particular semester or quarter has begun. All CSU listed fees should be regarded as estimates that are subject to change upon approval by the Board of Trustees, the Chancellor or the Presidents, as appropriate. Changes in mandatory systemwide fees will be made in accordance with the requirements of the Working Families Student Fee Transparency and Accountability Act (Sections 66028 - 66028.6 of the Education Code).

Third Party Sponsors

If a Third Party Sponsor, such as a foreign government agency or business and/or educational institution, agrees to sponsor you by paying your tuition and fees, please get an authorization letter from the sponsor specifying how much of your tuition they will cover and for which semesters. Submit the authorization to SJSU's Bursar's Office, Attention: Third Party Sponsor or email the authorization to: student-sponsors-waivers@sjsu.edu and retain a copy of the letter for your records.

Financial Aid

Please note that international students are not eligible for federal or state financial aid.

Scholarships

Scholarships are available to international students through SJSU's Financial Aid and Scholarship Office. International students are only eligible for scholarships that are merit-based. Need-based scholarships are part of financial aid, which is unavailable to international students.

Installment Payment Plans

There are two installment plans, one for tuition and fees and one for on-campus housing. There are enrollment fees to participate in each.

Please note: Students are not able to sign up for the payment plans until charges actually appear on their account for either tuition and fees or housing charges.

International Wire Transfers

International students can now make payments via international wire transfer. San José State University has partnered with Flywire to streamline the tuition payment process for our international students. Flywire offers excellent foreign exchange rates, allowing you to pay in your home currency (in most cases) and save a significant amount of money, compared to traditional banks. You will be able to track the progress of your payment throughout the transfer process via a student dashboard, and you will also be notified via email when your payment is received by San José State.

SJSU or Flywire charges no fee for international wire transfers. The bank you use for sending wire transfers usually charges a fee, so check with that bank for its fee schedule.

Field Trip Fees

A few courses have additional field trip fees ranging from \$11 to \$52.

Special or Optional Fees

Parking permits are available for students. A daily one—semester parking permit is estimated at \$192. Parking permit information is available at sisu.edu/parking

Refunds

Students are highly encouraged to enroll in Direct Deposit. With Direct Deposit, you receive your refund several days quicker than a paper check and more securely. To enroll, log in to one.sjsu.edu and search for the Direct Deposit for Student Refunds tile by typing "direct deposit" into the search box provided. To learn more visit sjsu.edu/bursar

Bookstore Charges

Registered students can charge books and supplies purchased at the Spartan Bookstore to their MySJSU student account up to \$900 per semester. For more details visit sjsu.edu/bursar/our-services/spartan-bookstore-voucher.php

Keeping MySJSU Current

SJSU has established a business practice whereby all payments apply to the oldest debt on your account. For example, if you are making a registration payment and you have a housing debt with an earlier due date, the payment will apply to the housing charges first. Keep your account current to avoid the possibility of enrollment cancellation.

Any delinquent outstanding charges owed to the university will be submitted to the Franchise Tax Board for tax refund offset. The university, or its authorized agent, has the right to pursue collection efforts to repay a delinquent debt owed to the university.

Complete Immigration Document Process

F-1 Visas

Coming from a U.S. Institution

To complete this process, you must show your admission letter to your current school's international office. Once your current institution sends your electronic I-20 document through SEVIS, you will receive a Transfer-Pending Form I-20 from SJSU.

Coming from Outside the U.S.

You will receive a U.S. Immigration Form I-20 directly from San José State electronically with your letter of admission. To start the application process for an F-1 student visa, first complete the I-901 form online through SEVIS at ice.gov/sevis/i901, then pay the SEVIS fee and print out the receipt. To obtain your F-1 visa, make an appointment for a visa interview and go to the nearest U.S. Consulate with the following:

- Your current passport
- SJSU admission letter
- Your I-20 (Certificate of Eligibility) form
- Proof (receipt) of SEVIS payment
- Proof of financial support
- DS-160 application form (ceac.state.gov/genniv)
- Other supporting documents, as indicated on the website of the U.S. Embassy or Consulate you will be visiting

Customs and Immigration at the Airport

Please expect this process to be a lengthy experience and prepare in advance. You must keep the following documents in your carry-on luggage so you are able to present them to a Customs and Border Protection (CBP) officer:

- Passport (must be valid for at least six months after the date of entry)
- F-1 visa stamp, valid at the time of entry
- Form I-20 must be valid
- Proof of financial support and resources reflected on Form I-20
- Tuition and/or Housing receipt(s), if you have made payments prior to your arrival
- SEVIS fee receipt

Canadian citizens are not required to apply for a visa to enter the U.S. as an F-1 student, but must still pay the SEVIS fee at least three business days before their intended travel date, and present their Form I-20 at the U.S. port of entry.

Attend Global Spartan Welcome (GSW)

F-1 students are required to attend Global Spartan Welcome (GSW), a program specifically for international students. Because you are classified as a new F-1 international student at SJSU, you are required to attend GSW, a mandatory session to educate you on your F-1 status and how to adjust to life at SJSU and in a new culture. Please check your email regularly for communication from ISSS regarding the required documents and information to complete your immigration check-in and maintain your F-1 status. The immigration document check-in process is a federal requirement.

Complete Upper-Division Writing Directed Self Placement Exercise

The Upper-Division Writing Directed Self-Placement (UDW-DSP) is an exercise (not a test) that helps students place themselves in the appropriate writing course at SJSU. Before registering for an upper division writing course (100W), students must earn a "C-" or better grade in a GE Area 1B: Critical Thinking (formerly GE Area A3) or equivalent second-semester composition course and complete the UDW-DSP.

What you need to do:

- Make sure you have met the above criteria in order to complete the UDW-DSP
- Go to sisu.edu/wac/wst and read the information there
- Click on the link "Begin the Upper-Division Writing Directed Self-Placement Exercise" and complete the exercise (this will only take 10-15 minutes)
- Make sure you complete the UDW-DSP before you enroll in your courses at SJSU
