It explores questions about gender, sex, and oppression as they apply to various domains of our lives—including but not limited to science, politics, and economics. By examining how feminist thought has transformed traditional debates in philosophy, opened new areas for exploration, and highlighted the epistemic and ethical importance of inclusivity, this course shows how feminist considerations are relevant not only for women but also for society as a whole.
